# Prepare for Winter Weather

We encourage everyone to prepare their vessel for wintertime conditions and use caution during inclement weather. Check your bilge pumps, dock lines, secure halyards and canvas, and remove your sails. Make sure the Harbor Office has updated phone numbers in the event we need to contact you. Check the October Marina newsletter for additional ideas on winterizing your boat.

Freezing temperatures bring snow and ice. The harbor provides buckets of traction sand and scoops located at each ramp. We also have a limited number of shovels available to borrow for you to remove snow from your boat. Please return the sand buckets and shovels as soon as possible. Also, please disconnect hoses from the spigot at your slip to prevent expensive freeze damage to the spigot. If extended periods of freezing weather are expected, the dock water may be shut off for the duration of the freeze. Boaters and liveaboards requiring water should plan

on keeping water tanks
full. The harbor will restore
water as soon as threat of
freeze damage passes.



Make it a habit to wear a personal flotation device (PFD) with a loud whistle attached. If you fall in, a PFD buys you time while you try to self-rescue or call for help. Remember that dock ladders are located throughout both marinas. Make note of their locations as you walk down the dock. From the waterside, the slips with ladders are marked with a vellow and black arrow on the end of the finger floats which point towards the next slip with a ladder in it. If you moor next to a ladder, please keep it clear of dock lines and other obstructions. Do not forget that many boats have ladders on their transom or swim-step. Do not be afraid to use the most convenient means of rescue



# Commercial Gear Storage at Squalicum Harbor

Effective January 1, 2023, Squalicum Harbor is asking that all commercial fishing gear and net trailers be stored either in front of your weblocker or at the upland storage yard off F-Street. Customers with fishing gear stored in a parking lot should contact the Squalicum Harbor Office to discuss storage options. Any gear left on the Squalicum Harbor property after January 1, 2023 will be disposed of in accordance with the Port's abandoned property policy.

### **Marina Safety - Shore Power Cords**

This is a reminder that only marine rated power cords are permitted to connect your vessel to shore-power. Keep your cord in good shape by using the appropriate strain relief, preventing it from draping into the water, and ensuring the cord wires are not pinched or crushed. Cords and connectors should be inspected often and replaced when damage or corrosion is discovered. Boat US recommends that plugs with brown discoloration at the base of the blades or a worn coating or pitting should not be used. Boat US also recommends inspecting your vessel's shore power inlet at least every 5 years. Consult a qualified marine electrician if you have any questions about your electrical system
