

Round and Round We Go: New Blaine Roundabout Construction Completed in May

With major construction completed, the roundabouts at the junction of Marine Drive, Peace Portal Way and D-street were opened to traffic Wednesday, May 19. Although open to traffic, some temporary nighttime lane closures will occur to complete street lighting and pavement marking. There are a few key things to remember when driving in roundabouts:

- Yield to drivers in the roundabout
- Stay in your lane; do not change lanes
- Do not stop in the roundabout
- Always drive counter-clockwise through the roundabout
- Yield to pedestrians as with a signalized intersection



- Bicyclists should follow the same rules as a motorist or walk their bike on the sidewalk
- In the event of emergency vehicles, proceed through the roundabout and then pullover.

Keep Personal Items Off Docks and Floats

The docks and finger floats are for safe walking to and from your vessel. They should not be used to store items like crab pots, boarding steps, hoses, and dinghies that can become trip hazards. In particular, boarding steps should be small enough to be stored aboard your vessel when not in use to allow your dock-mate ample room on the finger float. Please store loose

items aboard your vessel.

Dinghies and tenders not stored aboard your vessel can be stored in the racks on a first come, first served basis.

All dinghies stored in dinghy racks must have the owner's name and contact information clearly marked. Staff will begin checking the racks for abandoned dinghies in the next few weeks.

If you're planning an extended boating vacation this summer, please check in at the Blaine Harbor office before you leave. Asphalt seal-coating and lot striping in the Gate 2 and 3 parking lots is scheduled for this summer. It is important that you not park cars in those lots and leave on an extended vacation. Harbor staff can direct you to long-term parking outside the construction zone.

We have an approximate time line for the work to be done, but actual work dates will depend on weather windows.



Sublease and Loan-a-Slip Programs Offer Flexibility for Permanent and Visiting Boaters

When planning your summer cruising adventure, take a moment to review the sublease and loan-a-slip programs. Both offer flexibility and may provide you with cost savings while you are away.

Sublease: If you are gone for more than one month, and pay your moorage monthly, the sublease program may benefit you. To sign up, swing by the Harbor Office and fill out the necessary sublease paperwork.

We advertise the availability of your slip for you, and people who need temporary moorage can then sign up for your slip. Keep in mind that you are responsible for paying all moorage fees *until* someone signs up to sublease your slip. If we do temporarily assign your slip, the moorage customer subleasing from you pays the monthly moorage and electricity.

You would pay a the Port a \$50 setup fee and a \$15 sublease fee for the first month, and a \$15 sublease fee every month after that. You can sublease your slip to another boater for up to 12 months.

Loan-a-Slip: The Loan-a-Slip program allows the Harbor staff to assign visitors, for up to two weeks



per calendar month, in your slip while you are gone. If your slip is assigned during the entire time you designate, 50% of all moorage fees collected will be credited back to your account.

We ask that you give us advance notice of your return so that your slip will be ready for your arrival.

Both moorage programs are designed to provide flexibility and options for our permanent and visiting customers and must be administered through the Harbor Office
