### **GARBAGE FACILITIES FOR BOATERS ONLY**

A friendly reminder that garbage facilities at Port of Bellingham mooring facilities are for boater-generated garbage only. From time to time, we come across household trash left in the dumpsters. If you suspect that someone may be dumping household trash illegally on Port property, please contact the Harbor Office as soon as possible so we can contact the people involved.

### **AVOID HEAT-RELATED FUEL SPILLS**

Now that the sun has reappeared, we'd like to remind our boaters to be careful when leaving portable gas tanks and hoses in the hot sun. Every summer we respond to outboard style fuel tanks and hoses that are leaking because hot fuel has expanded. Please take the necessary steps to plan ahead and prevent fuel spills.

### **GATE 3, F & G REPLACEMENT PROJECT UPDATE**

The Gate 3, F and G Dock replacement project is currently scheduled to begin this fall. Over the last few years, Port staff have worked closely with the Marina Advisory Committee on this project. When construction begins, boaters can expect to see the demolition of the existing wooden and concrete docks. A crane barge will then begin the process of dredging the waterway. Barges will be used to transport the dredge materials to their interim placement location at the Cornwall Avenue Landfill site. Finally, new concrete floats and piling will be installed. The current schedule has the newly installed docks in service in the spring of 2012. Port staff is working on vessel accommodations during the project and will put a project page on the Port's website. Stay tuned for more details on this exciting project.

## YACHT CLUB'S PITCH REGATTA RETURNS IN SEPTEMBER

## Watching the Regatta

If you plan to watch the racing action from your boat, here are some helpful tips to keep you and the racers safe:

- Spectator boats should be at least 100 yards away from a racing yacht.
- Spectator boats should avoid placing themselves between the wind and the racing boat.
- Spectator boats are best placed well clear of the start and finish line and should never be in front or behind the start/finish line.
- Spectator boats should place themselves well away of the upwind mark and well downwind of the downwind mark. These marks are exciting positions to watch a race from.

#### WAR ON TUNICATES CONTINUES

early the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife completed their annual underwater assessment for club tunicates (Styela clava) at Blaine Harbor.



Tunicates are an invasive marine species that pose a serious threat to shellfish beds and marine habitat. Since the assessment and removal program began in 2006, the WDFW has been very successful at removing tunicates from Blaine Harbor waters and preventing their spread. Regular vessel haulouts and hull cleanings at approved boat yards are an effective method of curbing the spread of the club tunicate.
