#### **NEWS BRIEF**

#### **SQUALICUM HARBOR FIRE RECOVERY UNDERWAY**

Most of you already are aware of the tragic and devastating boathouse fire at Squalicum Harbor on March 30, which resulted in the loss of the lives of two dedicated members of our Bellingham boating community – Jim Langei and Sterling Taylor.

Our hearts go out to their friends, family and everyone who knew them in the boating community.

The fire completely destroyed the G-East Boathouse and everything inside of it. Bellingham police and fire investigators worked diligently to investigate this fire, but have not yet determined a cause. They sought the assistance of federal fire investigators and now are working with insurance company investigators.

Some of you have written us questions or spoken at meetings about your fire safety concerns and we are taking all of your concerns seriously and are working with the Bellingham Fire Department to discuss fire safety in our marinas.

Modern marinas, like ours, are equipped with a standpipe system that provides pressurized water to fire fighters, allowing them to connect their hoses to our pipes. Firefighters conduct drills during the year to practice rapidly deploying to our marinas and connecting to our system. As of the time of this newsletter, we are overseeing a large salvage effort to remove all of the burned debris from the harbor and we are preparing to determine the damage to the surrounding infrastructure. Again, this is another area for which we do not yet have a lot of answers.

We know the opening of the new Gate 3 docks, which were under construction at the time of the fire, have been delayed. We do not yet have a new opening date.

#### PROPOSED CLEANUP OF BLAINE MARINA INC FUELING SITE

The Port and Washington Department of Ecology have completed a draft legal agreement for the Blaine Marina, Inc. cleanup site located in the western portion of the Blaine Harbor industrial area at the fueling facility along McMillan Avenue. When final, this agreement will require the Port to develop a cleanup plan for historic contamination at the site and to repair a damaged timber bulkhead which is failing and at risk of spreading contamination to the waters of Blaine Harbor. Ecology is inviting the public to review the proposed legal agreement and submit comments from April 9 through May 9. #### WSDOT PLANS MARINE DRIVE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

This summer, the City of Blaine is planning road improvements to Marine Drive from the Peace Portal roundabout to the railroad tracks, starting after July 4. The project will improve pedestrian and bicycle access to the harbor. Construction will be funded primarily from a Washington State Transportation Improvement Board Grant. Short delays during the project can be expected.

#### GATE 3 IMPROVEMENTS, STAFF WORKING ON NEW MOORAGE ASSIGNMENTS

Although the harbor fire delayed opening of our Gate 3, F and G replacement project, most of the work is nearly complete on this project. The docks and piling have all been installed and utilities are in place. The dredged materials are all now in their interim placement area at the Cornwall Avenue Landfill and the processing area at the former Georgia Pacific site is demobilized.

The Harbor Office is working on outlining the moorage assignment process for the new floats. We appreciate everyone's support and flexibility during this important waterfront project. ### GATE CODES CHANGING, OFFICE BEGINS EXTENDED SUMMER HOURS

Please identify yourself and give the Harbor Staff your current account number. Please do not share your code with people who do not have boats in the harbor. Keep an eye out and report any suspicious activity to the Harbor Office. From May 7 through the end of September the gates will remain open during the day. The Squalicum Harbor Office hours will be 8am to 7pm, every day, starting April 1 through the end of September.
